Spruce/Debbie Colgrove Your sewing machine guide is the best place to learn how to thread a sewing machine, but if you want to get started and don't have the manual of your machine, the basics of threading the sewing machine can get you started. When threading a sewing machine, be sure to thread them with the press foot up. When the foot of the press is in an upward position, the tension is released, which allows the thread to sit properly. You can check the difference by pulling the thread on the needle with the foot press up and with the foot of the press down-thread will pull smoothly if sitting properly. In a box of old things headed to the ground to fill was an old singer, so that's what I did. All I have to say is ya'gotta' love plexi glass. You'll need a few things; All the things I used were just leftovers from other projects. If you have leftovers too, then yippee for you! Well, however you manage to get the things you need... A; sewing machine (check around you should be able to find an old dust collection some place for pretty cheap, or perhaps free!! or you may already have one that is worthy of a small hack. B; Plexi Glass, if you don't have it yet you can get it from any major hardware store like Lowes or Home Depot. (I like Lowes better than myself). A large enough piece should not be larger than about 10 or 15 bux in a pinch. C; hot gun glue and glue sticks. ... You can use silicone glue or epoxy resin, but glue sticks set quickly and cheaply. D; paper of some kind (for stencil shapes you'll cut out of plexi-glass)... I used a piece of contractor's paper, but a printer paper or an old paper bag, whatever worked. Along with the paper, you will need to write utensils. I used Sharpie. I like my Sharpie, he doesn't E; several flat-headed propeller drivers. (to open the machine) F; the last, but equally important, wonderful tool known as the Dremmel Tool. (and cutting drives) now you take a screwdriver with a flat head, and you'll be two or three screws on top of the sewing machine (at the mine they were drowned about an inch down.) and then gently lift the upper body up and away from the thing. You can also decide how I did to remove the piece that goes just above the needle. (The one I disassembled with just one screw to hold this piece because it is removed to replace the light bulb that on my model is placed inside this part) this old machine also had a separate part that covered the belt-drive and pulley, so I pulled it out too (because I figured why not put a box in it too). Okay, now before we get going I have to say this plastic tends to spit almost microscopic specks of molten plastic shrapnel up and away from the cutting tool. This plastic also smells of cancer, so you can wear a dust mask or respirator before you start cutting through the plexi glass and old body parts. and safety glasses would probably be a good idea as well. Now that you decide to breathe in the plastic dust and get an itchy eye... (I see your brash self not wearing a dust mask or glasses, I know your look; I was once like you. . . . just last night when I did this hack.) Before you just start getting happy with chop-chop'ity, cutting, make sure you've checked to see your particular machine where the best places to cut may or may not be. Once you've figured out where the cut go on it.... Then use the holes that you have cut as patterns for plexi glass. Use paper and marker and just trace the shapes you need, then transfer the pieces to the plexi glass, placing them over the paper. When in doubt, cut the shape of Lil' too big and then widdle it back to a better fit..... hay, I think the name of this step spells out it, so go to it. OK, now warm up the glue gun and keep Dremmel plugged in for any minor adjustments... Put the hot glue around the edges to cut the part of the body as needed and then before it can cool to put the plexy in place. I'd say it's best to start with one big piece that goes on top, but that's just me. I glued one edge first in the style of tack welding. Then when I knew he posted where I wanted him I locked it more tightly. I then put in smaller bits and adjusted em' to fit the tighter. once you have all the windows where you want to collect all the body parts and find the right screws for each piece. and admire your work and look with surprise at the hours of work movement parts inside the sewing machine. As you look out the window you install ya 'gotta love like Plexi-glass and Dremmel tool.
